HIGHER EDUCATION AS A NATIONAL PRIORITY: WHAT SORT OF REVOLUTION IS NEEDED?

Emeritus Professor John Hay takes pleasure in what he terms advocacy on behalf of the knowledge industry, and an ability to communicate jargon-free.

Looking back on his time at UQ, he feels the better part of his time was spent “trying to identify exciting ideas, whether they are mine or other people’s, and creating the institutional space for them. That’s what preoccupies me.” “No matter how difficult the situation in terms of funding has been, I’ve been able to work with fantastically able people, to collaborate with them,” he says. “Against the physical and funding disadvantages, academic staff have done amazing things.”

As Ken Wiltshire, the UQ business school’s professor of public administration, sees it, Hay worked adroitly to establish partnerships with Australian and overseas universities, building on government policy and his extraordinary Midas touch with Feeney’s Atlantic Philanthropies. “It is certainly an example of a very astute strategy from a vice-chancellor to focus on comparative advantage, to use alliances and a major public policy initiative and build up research capacity,” Wiltshire says.

John Hay became Chairman of the Queensland Art Gallery Board of Trustees in February 2008. From 1996 to 2007, he was Vice-Chancellor of The University of Queensland where he led the development of major new research institutes in such fields as molecular bioscience, brain research, bio-engineering and nano-technology, clinical medical research, sustainable mining and many others. He also established the new Mayne Centre Art Gallery and Australia's first national collection of artists' self-portraits.

He is currently chair of, among other boards, the Carrick Institute for Learning and Teaching in Higher Education. He chairs or is a member of many other State and national committees, ranging across many disciplines from the performing arts to science, technology, innovation, information systems, libraries, city planning and economic development.
