Frans J. Nauta (1966) is professor of Innovation at HAN University in Arnhem, The Netherlands. Before he was appointed professor at HAN University he was founder & CEO of the Knowledge Land foundation (KL). KL has established a reputation as the leading Dutch think tank on knowledge economy and was one of the driving forces behind the establishment of the Dutch national Innovation Platform. The platform is chaired by the Prime Minister and coordinates the national policies for education, research, technology and innovation. It's eighteen members from the cabinet, business and the knowledge infrastructure. Frans was the first secretary and a member of the platform. He was a member of the board of VPRO (Dutch public broadcasting company), writes as a columnist for Dutch magazines, is a guest lecturer at several universities (Leiden, Amsterdam, Free University) and has extensive experience as professional speaker on knowledge economy, innovation and leadership for a wide range of audiences in a number of countries.
