•• GEOFF GALLOP

Professor Geoff Gallop was elected the 27th Premier of Western Australia. He was awarded the Rhodes Scholarship in 1972 and graduated in philosophy, politics and economics at the University of Oxford in 1974. He was awarded his doctorate by Oxford University in 1983, lectured in social and political theory and has been a strong campaigner in the areas of health, education and crime prevention

At the State election in February 2001, Dr Gallop led the Labor Party to victory, winning a record 14 seats. He resigned his premiership on January 16, 2006, for health reasons. Professor Gallop now directs the Graduate School of Government at the University of Sydney.

Examining the relationship between politics, leadership, service delivery and policy design, Prof. Gallop also makes the case that principles such as accountability and sustainability are at the heart of what should be the end goal for government – the creation of healthy communities.
